COTTINGHAM METHODIST CHURCH welcomes performers, teachers and audience to the 45th Annual Musical Festival. The Festival is run to give performers an opportunity to perform in a friendly environment, for them to receive constructive criticism and to give us all an opportunity to enjoy their performance. We recognise the hard work they do along with the dedication of teachers and supporters.

FESTIVAL DATES:

Timings and days below are *provisional and may change*, depending on how many entries we receive in each section. It is possible that we may need to use additional evenings. Classes will be held at the Methodist Church, Hallgate, Cottingham.

TROPHIES are awarded in most classes and are held by the winners for one year. They must be returned to the Trophy Secretaries by the date requested. Trophies are the responsibility of the winner during that time, any damage incurred should be repaired at their expense and they should be returned in a clean condition. The cost and arranging of engraving (if required) are also the responsibility of the holder.

Trophies will only be awarded where the recipient is in one of the top 3 categories – for categories see page 5.

VICTOR LUDORUM SHIELDS:

Special awards are made for the most meritorious performance in each section of the Festival and are presented at the discretion of the Festival Committee and Adjudicators. The winners will each receive a cheque from the Friends of the Festival to help them in their studies.

OTHER TROPHIES: The Eardley Kemp and Frederick Ingilby Trophies are presented to the most promising musicians in the Festival.

NEW CLASSES: We have introduced a number of new classes this year, including classes for adult pianists and some non-competitive classes. Please let us know what you think!

FESTIVAL CELEBRATION CONCERT: A number of performers, representing all age groups and sections of the Festival, will be invited to perform at this event, the date of which will be confirmed by January. Since 1985 (37 years) the concerts have raised over £14,500 for various charities. Our most recent concert in 2020 was in aid of Hull Sound Circles. This year's Charity is to be announced.

OUR ADJUDICATORS

DAVID BEER is a professional conductor and pianist. He taught music in schools, before embarking on a full-time career as a freelance conductor.

He has conducted many West End and international touring shows including Fame, Guys and Dolls, Me and My Girl, We Will Rock You, Cats, Aspects of Love, Jesus Christ Superstar and Joseph and appeared on TV, radio, played on film soundtracks, and recorded 3 original cast albums.

He was Director of Music at the BRIT School for Performing Arts, Director of Performance at the Academy of Contemporary Music and has been a vocal coach and singing teacher at many leading drama colleges, including Guildhall, GSA, Italia Conti and RADA. He works regularly as Musical Director at Arts Educational Schools London, and Chichester University.

David is an examiner for London College of Music and was recently awarded an FLCM for Professional Achievement. He is a Music Mentor for Music for Youth; as an Adjudicator, he has adjudicated many festivals nationwide.

He now lives in Lincolnshire, teaches singing and piano, and conducts and accompanies adult and children's choirs.

FIONA BERRY is a freelance music teacher, creative artist and tutor based in Lancashire. She is a graduate of Huddersfield University where she studied Saxophone with Richard Ingham and Flute with Nichola Hunter. She is also the author of the book Play Music Better.

As a saxophonist in her early years, she studied with Tim Redpath, founder member of the Apollo Saxophone Quartet and gained her ATCL diploma on Flute before leaving school.

Fiona is an examiner for Trinity College London and currently teaches both privately and through her online academy, Learn Music Together. Her online program helps adults grow and develop their musical skills in an environment that nurtures confidence.

In her previous role at Bolton School Fiona established the saxophone as one of the most popular instruments to study. She has also directed numerous prize-winning ensembles including the Jazz Berries and Saxberries.

As an ensemble director, she has both conducted and performed at events such as Montreux Jazz Festival and the World Saxophone Congress. Fiona specialises in both classical and Jazz and is adept at teaching both contemporary techniques and improvisation.

ANDREW PADMORE

Andrew studied with Sidney Harrison, Christopher Robinson, Sir Adrian Boult. He has been Head of Music in a large Grammar School, a Cathedral Organist and Master of Choristers, and a Conductor of Choirs and Choral Societies worldwide.

As well as being an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals, he is an examiner of Diplomas for ABRSM.

Andrew is also a teacher of singing who gives master-classes and workshops for singers and choirs. He is a regular Conductor for Yorkshire Voices, and Yorkshire Philharmonic and a guest conductor for Orchestras and Choirs Internationally. He also regularly accompanies singers in recitals and gives organ recitals.

RULES

1. ENTRIES:

See the Entry Form for details of how to enter by post or email. It would help us enormously if you could download an entry form and type your entry, rather than handwrite it (especially your email address!).

Entry closing date

Monday 24th October 2022

Fees are shown for each class within the syllabus. Fees cannot be refunded except where the Festival cancels a class. Payment may be made by BACS, Cheque (payable to "CMCMF") or cash.

2. **ENTRANTS** may perform once only in each class, except for duet and trio classes where they may play more than once as long as they have different partners, or are a bona fide member of two choirs or groups. They may only perform any piece once in any year's festival.

3. DUET & TRIO PARTNERS:

If one partner is unable to compete due to illness or accident, a substitute partner may play or sing, provided that the Secretary has notice of this, at the latest, the day before the class is due to take place. We trust performers and teachers not to take advantage of this rule simply because one partner has not had time to learn the piece, or obtain music in time.

4. AGES:

Performers should calculate their age as at January 15th 2023.

5. GRADES:

Where the grade is given, this is the grade we would expect the performer to have attained. Should they have since progressed to a higher grade but not taken the exam we would expect them to enter the class at the higher grade to ensure we have performances of a similar standard, to make fair competition. For example, a

performer who has taken and passed grade 2, is missing out Grade 3 and currently working towards Grade 4, should enter for the Grade 3 class. If they are missing 2 exams and working towards grade 5, they should enter the Grade 4 class.

We realise this puts an onus on the performer and their teacher but trust that we can rely on their integrity.

6. MUSIC for the ADJUDICATOR:

Copies of own choice music must be supplied for the adjudicator on the day of the Festival and should be handed in at the Registration Desk at least 15 minutes before the start of the class. The copy for the adjudicator must be clearly marked with performer's name, class and ballot number (plus the title and composer of the music if this is not clear).

The title and composer of own choice pieces must also be clearly written on the entry card, which should be handed in along with the music, at the Registration Desk, at least 15 minutes before the start of the class

7. ACCOMPANISTS:

Performers are advised to bring their own accompanist if at all possible especially if they choose a complicated piece of music that is not only difficult for the soloist and/or the accompanist, but challenging for the integration of the two, where they need to be able to rehearse with the accompanist. If they have time the Festival's accompanists may allow rehearsals (at a fee).

Music should be clearly marked with the performer's name and class, and any musical markings made clear, especially speed. Accompanists should be provided with an original copy for performance. If you ask to use the official

accompanist then you must do so or risk disqualification or an additional charge.

8. AWARDS:

1st, 2nd, and 3rd place certificates will be awarded where appropriate in each class. All performers will receive an adjudication. Awards will be withheld if, in the opinion of the adjudicator, the standard of performance is not high enough.

TROPHIES WILL ONLY BE AWARDED WHERE THE RECIPIENT IS IN ONE OF THE TOP 3 CATEGORIES.

The adjudicator's decision is final.

Communication with the Adjudicator concerning any matters relating to the competition by entrants, teachers or other interested parties is prohibited and may lead to disqualification.

The Committee reserves the right to withhold the presentation of trophies to this year's winners if, as past winners, they have persistently failed to return trophies, in a clean condition, within the set time schedule.

9. RECORDING & PHOTOGRAPHY:

The Festival is bound by copyright law and licensing of performances, hence, during performance or adjudication, the taking of photographs and making of **recordings or videos**, including on a mobile phone, **are strictly prohibited**.

10. TIME LIMITS:

In the own choice classes, maximum time limits will be strictly adhered to. Performers must note that their performance may be stopped if they exceed the limit and they may not be given a mark, only an adjudication. There is no requirement to fill the whole of the allocated time.

11. ALTERATIONS & CANCELLATIONS:

The organisers reserve the right to cancel any classes which have too few entries, or to re-time

any classes or make any alteration as may be necessary for the smooth running of the Festival. In the event of an adjudicator being unavailable the organisers will appoint an accredited substitute. Where any part of the programme has to be postponed or cancelled, we regret we will not be able to refund or credit entry fees.

12. PHOTOCOPYING OF MUSIC:

(a) Photocopying of sheet music is illegal unless you have written permission from the publisher, except as in (b) below.

(b) Adjudicator Copy - A person performing at the Festival may make one copy for the adjudicator provided that the performer has already purchased his/her own copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed by the Festival

(c) Where the performer requires the services of the official accompanist, they should provide an original copy of the work for performance.

(d) The performer and accompanist should have, with them, original copies (or proof of legal download) of the work for the performance at the Festival.

These rules are set by The Music Publishers Association in conjunction with the British and International Federation of Festivals. Performers finding difficulty in obtaining extra copies should apply to the publishers who are usually very sympathetic in granting permission to copy for a small fee. If you are in any doubt please contact The Music Publishers Association at 103 Kingsway, London WC2B 6QX.

13. PROFESSIONAL STATUS:

The Festival is intended for amateurs. For the purposes of this Festival, an amateur is considered to be one who does not receive more than out of pocket expenses for services rendered in that branch of the art with which the competition is concerned. This rule does not apply to conductors. There is also an exemption for one performer in class 561.

MARKING will be based on the Federation set of descriptors as shown below.

If the services of the official accompanists are required, this should be clearly marked on the entry form.

Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone

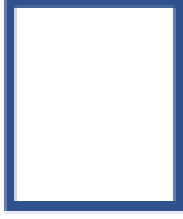


The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to provide safer festivals for everyone:

1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival:

3. Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice leaflet, Festival Child Protection leaflet, and any other guidance produced by the Federation. This advice is supported by support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Guidance includes clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending/performing at a Federation Festival
5. All Festival personnel wear a badge to identify their roles. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Festival badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition, we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take any responsibility for property left unattended.
7. We do not permit any unauthorised photography at our Federation Festivals. For further information on what is and is not authorised, please contact the Festival Safeguarding Officer or anyone wearing a festival badge. If any child, young person or parent/carer is concerned about any photography or recording taking place at an event, please contact the Festival Safeguarding Officer, who will be pleased to discuss this matter with you.
8. Some children and adults with support needs may need help in order to take part. If this is the case, we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Organisers prior to arrival. The Festival aims to meet these needs wherever possible but must know beforehand in order to prepare support – or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and its approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone are published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or adults of any age who may require additional support) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.

Child Protection Policy Statement

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech (BIFF) works for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.



The Federation and our member Festivals are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind.

We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals. It has been drawn up on the basis of relevant law and guidance that seeks to protect children and young people, and its purpose is to set out the overarching principles that guide our approach.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- appointing a Federation Head of Safeguarding and, for each festival, at least one Festival Safeguarding Officer
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- working within the legislation and guidance that specifically addresses the needs of young performers (specifically, the Children and Young People Acts 1933 and 1963, and the Children (Performance and Activities) (England) Regulations 2014
- adopting a safe and balanced approach to the issue of creating and using photography and images of children and young people at our festivals and in our communications
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in line with NSPCC guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance.

Test: One piece of the performer's choice from this repertoire, not to exceed 4 mins.

Test: Any song of the performer's choice by a British Composer, excluding pieces belonging to the Stage Musical Repertoire, not to exceed 4 mins.

Class 403 ORATORIO SOLO
Test: One piece from an Oratorio, Passion or Mass by Bach, Handel, Haydn, Mendelssohn, Mozart or Vivaldi, not to exceed 6 minutes.

Class 404 OPERA SOLO
Test: Any song from the opera repertoire (not including G & S), not to exceed 4 mins.

Class 405 LIEDER SOLO
Test: Any Lieder solo, not to exceed 6 minutes.

Class 406 UNACCOMPANIED FOLK SONG
Test: Any genuine folk song of the performer's choice, not to exceed 3 mins.

Class 407 STAGE MUSICAL SOLO (inc. Gilbert & Sullivan and Light Opera)

Test: Any Stage Musical song (including Gilbert & Sullivan and Light Opera) of the performer's choice, not to exceed 4 min.

Class 408 SACRED SOLO

Test: Any Sacred Song of the performer's choice, not to exceed 4 mins.

Class 409 HYMN SINGING

Test: Any hymn of the performer's choice (maximum 3 verses), from any Hymn or Chorus book; may be sung unaccompanied or accompanied by piano or other solo instrument.

Class 410 SPIRITUAL

Test: Any genuine Spiritual of the performer's choice, may be sung unaccompanied or be accompanied by piano or other solo instrument; not to exceed 4 minutes.

Class 411 DUET

Test: Any duet of the performers' choice, not to exceed 4 minutes.

Class 412 OVER 60's OWN CHOICE, ANY VOICE, 60 years & over

Test: Any song of the performer's choice, not to exceed 4 minutes.

Class 413 FOREIGN COMPOSERS' SOLO

Test: Any song by any foreign composer, not including German Lieder, not to exceed 4 mins to be sung in the original language (as long as it's not English).

* a trio may include up to one player who is under 18, to make a viable group.

TWO SKILLS Two different instruments (option including the voice), requiring different techniques, to be played/sung separately by one performer i.e. one performer – two instruments.
The performer may be accompanied or unaccompanied.

Test: For each instrument one piece not being played in any other class.
